European Credit Transfer System (ECTS)

A full workload for one semester is 60 Queen's Units (also known as CATS points). Most modules have a weighting of 20 Units, although some subject areas also offer half modules worth 10 Units and double modules worth 40 Units.

To convert Queen's Units to ECTS points, divide by two. For example, a full-time workload for one semester is 60 Units, which is equal to 30 ECTS points. Most Queen's modules have a weighting of 20 Units, which is equal to 10 ECTS points.
