DIFFERENT LAW PATHWAYS AVAILABLE AT QUEEN'S



Single Honours Programme

LLB Law - 3 years Covers the subjects needed for a QLD **plus** gives students a range of additional options in final year

Joint Honours Programmes

LLB Law with Politics - 3 years Covers the subjects needed for a QLD plus Politics modules plus opportunity for option(s) in final year

LLB Law with French - 4 years (third year spent in a university in France) Covers the subjects needed for a QLD plus French modules plus opportunity for option(s) in final year

LLB Law with Spanish - 4 years (third year spent in a university in Spain) Covers all the subjects needed for a QLD plus Spanish modules plus opportunity for option(s) in final year

YEAR ONE WHAT TO EXPECT



Law Lectures

- Combined large group teaching in lecture theatres
- 2 hours per week in class per module
- Independent reading/study time
- Ongoing assignments or end of term exam

Law Tutorials

- Small group teaching
- Weekly or bi-weekly (depends on the subject)
- Expanded teaching team
- Deeper level of discussion and problem question
- Encouraging participation and group-led discussions

New module to help students


A zero-credit module embedded centrally within our curriculum at Level 1 to help our student think more strategically about their career choices.
