

Terms and Conditions For Partner Summer School Programmes

1. This programme is for current registered undergraduate students of the Faculty of Engineering and Physical Sciences at the point of the programme application.
2. Students may apply for all opportunities available through Jetset 2025, however, only one application will be successful. Awards cannot be transferred to Partner Programmes, so students should apply for both if interested. If a student submits multiple applications, they must email askeps@qub.ac.uk to confirm their preferred order of choice.
3. Students must be available to attend the full programme they are applying for on the advertised dates.
4. Students must be in good academic standing. If a student needs to be in Belfast to undertake a failed exam then this takes priority and hence the student must cancel their trip and return the scholarship to the faculty. Students need to therefore make sure that their flights etc. allow for, or are insured against, such a case.
5. Students are not eligible if they have previously taken part in any international opportunities within the University including summer schools, short-term study exchanges or international work placements. This includes any scholarships provided by Global Opportunities. Checks will be made and applications will be withdrawn if students have been receipt of any other scholarship relating to international opportunities.
6. Students must complete an application form and answer three short questions. Applications will be assessed by the schools and will be scored out of 30. The highest scoring students will be offered the award. A reserve list will be in place, and if additional funds become available, more places may be offered. In the result of a tie, academic standing will be considered.
7. Upon successful application, students will be asked to make a contribution of £500 to secure their placement on the programme. A payment link will be provided with a submission deadline. Once confirmed, students should complete the application process with the chosen university. If for any reason, the programme is unable to go ahead or the student is not accepted onto the partner programme, participants will be provided with a full refund.
8. We are committed to ensuring that all students, regardless of personal circumstances or background, should have an equal opportunity to participate in Higher Education. Therefore, successful applicants who are in receipt of a full maintenance grant or who are care leavers/care experienced students known to the Widening Participation Unit may be eligible for a 50% discount on the student contribution, thus reducing the contribution to £250.
9. If a student can no longer participate the following refund policy will apply. The date of withdrawal is the date the Faculty receives your cancellation in writing. Cancellation notices should be sent to askeps@qub.ac.uk. The faculty will acknowledge receipt. In exceptional circumstances and at the sole discretion of the University, a cancelled booking may be considered for a refund where a refund is not due. Students are required

to demonstrate, with supporting evidence, extenuating personal circumstances (for example, illness or bereavement) which prohibit them from attending.

10. This programme will cover tuition fees, travel and accommodation. All arrangements will be made by the university including travel.
11. It is the student's responsibility to ensure they meet the travel entry requirements set out by the Government of the Country they are choosing to join a summer school. This includes fulfilment of any visa or other entry requirements of the host country. If a visa is required, it is extremely important that students begin the application process at the earliest possible opportunity.
12. The university will complete an International Travel Risk Assessment form on the cohort's behalf.
13. All attendees on this programme must supply either a report of their trip or a video blog to the Faculty of EPS within four weeks of their return. Photographs of the trip will be welcomed and can include selfies along with photographs of work undertaken. A selection of travel reports/video blogs may be used as publicity material for future student mobility programmes or student recruitment purposes; however, the relevant authors will be asked in advance for permission.
14. If a student provides the University with incorrect or incomplete information, or if they fail to complete the activity or they do not meet the eligibility criteria for an award, the University, may terminate its agreement and will not pay any money to the student. If the money has already been provided, the university may require the student to return any money already paid.
15. You must not be in receipt of any other subsidy/bursary for this activity to be eligible. This includes, but is not restricted to, Erasmus/Turing funding and Travel scholarships that are awarded by the University's Student Scholarships and Awards Group. Checks will be made, and applications will be withdrawn if you have been in receipt of any other subsidy/ bursary relating to this activity.
16. Data held by the Faculty of Engineering and Physical Sciences Office will be processed in accordance with the University's Data Protection Policy and your rights under Data
