




# Origins of mass tourism

Developed under fascism (1939-1975)

Mainland Spanish government identified the potential of coastal tourism to earn foreign currency & modernize economy (1960s)

- Transition from agriculture to services
- Stem pattern of emigration
- Raise living standards
- Initiate social, cultural& economic change




# Agents of mass tourism: (1960-2000)

- Elite-led development strategy
- Operation controlled by Tour Operators based in NW Europe
- Tour operators acted as gatekeepers, arranging most of the components for a holiday
- 'Package Holiday' (flight, hotel, transfers)
- Customers picked from a brochure



(In 2000 Thomson bought by TUI AG. Touristik Union International is Europe's largest tour operator)

Single Industry Coastal Forms of Urbanisation



## Impact of mass tourism:

Loss of wetlands, agricultural land & habitats (1960-2000)



Alcudia – constructed on a dune system and drained wetlands adjacent to Albufera (1988 declared Natural Park and Wetland of International Importance)



Palma's International Airport (PMI) – 31m passengers p.a. – compared to LHR @ 79m, DUB @ 32m and BFS @ 6m (2023)

## Impact of mass tourism:

Traditional beach resort as a strip form of dense urbanization, specialized in nature, seasonal in activity

# Restructuring of Mass Tourism

Pulling apart the package tour (2000 onwards)

- ► EU liberalization of airline industry (1992-1997)
- Rise of budget airlines
- More choice on routes
- Lower ticket prices
- Direct sales
- Growth in EU air travel



# Restructuring of Mass Tourism

Pulling apart the package tour (2000 onwards)

Internet as a disruptive technology



- Direct marketing by Mallorcan businesses
- ► Empower consumers (search, comparison, reviews)
- Growth of independently organized holidays
- Erosion of power of Tour Operators
- Geographical expansion of mass tourism beyond beach resorts

# Restructuring of Mass Tourism

Pulling apart the package tour (2000 onwards)

- Promotion of Cultural & Heritage Tourism
- Offer experiences not easily found elsewhere
- Emphasise quality (not low cost & quantity)
- ■More inclusive of local entrepreneurs & places on the island
- ■Marketed as 'low impact' tourism











## 'Massification' of Tourism

Spaces on the island once neglected by mass tourism have been colonized by the independent tourists .....

Beach tourism now co-existswith cultural / heritage / activity tourism



(Rural villages / farmsteads & agro-tourism on offer)

(The heritage quarters of towns & cities on offer)



## 'Massification' of Tourism

Within 24 years visitor numbers have more than doubled Tourists' geographic impact on the island is now wider

Boom in legal & illegal construction / renovations



#### Port d'Andratx (SW Mallorca)

2013 - Eugenio Hidalgo, ex-mayor, given 2 year prison sentence for accepting bribes in return for building permits on rural land

#### Island

2024 - Estimated 3.5 million visitors stayed in illegal holiday apartments & a further 900,000 stayed in second homes they owned


Competition over space & housing

Growth in Short-Term Rentals (STR)

15k STRs now listed on the island




(Established in 2008)

Real estate speculation, rising property values, housing affordability crisis for residents

Competition over space & housing





#### Gentrification of Palma's core

Eviction of long-term residents Conversion of properties to STRs Closure of bakeries, cafes, retailers

Local character of neighbourhood replaced by a sanitised hipster's one

Congestion on roads (120k rental cars)



Rental cars shipped in from Barcelona



Congested rural roads



Continual program of widening & construction of highways across the island

▶ Pressure on supply of water (aquifers, 2 reservoirs & desalination plant – semi-arid environment), sanitation & waste management



Environmental degradation

3 to 5 cruise ships visit Palma each day Daily influx of 15,000 visitors 500 ships, 2 million visitors per year



Campaigns to limit or ban cruise ships (lhs) & to prioritize the needs of Palma's residents, not its visitors (rhs)

# Policy Response? Rejuvenate




Magaluf, Calvia municipality,

Calvia's LA21 is like 'putting lipstick on a gorilla'

#### Calvia's Local Agenda 21 (1995/97 onwards)

- Co-ordinated development plan
- Remodel promenades, insert green spaces & cycle paths
- Promote controlled use of water
- Protect remaining heritage & sensitive habtitats




# Policy Response? Containment

#### Regional Government of the Balearic Islands

- Sustainable Tourism Tax (2016)
  Charge visitors Eco-Tax per night of accommodation (1 to 4 euros)
  Funds used for environmental & heritage restoration
- Development Controls (2017-2022)
   Moratorium on construction of new accommodation
   Enforce licence (ETV) for owners of Short Term Rentals (15 staff)
   Creation of zones to control / phase out STR accommodation

# Zoning controls on tourist development



Introduction of Short Term Rental zoning permits (2017) to control geography of tourist development

Verdict - enforcement not sufficiently resourced with 3.5m tourists staying per year in illegal STRs (2024)

Red - coastal tourist saturated areas with controls - Purple – town & villages with controls - Orange – coastal areas not saturated - Blue – interior areas with few renting restrictions - - Yellow – restrictions on renting apartments but not villas - Green - protected rural land, no new ETV licences Grey – areas excluded from renting (i.e. industrial)

Incitement to drink alcohol legislation (2020)

Geographically targeted at Magaluf & S'Arenal

Ban happy hours, free bars & other drinks promotions

Ban drinking on the street or beaches

Off-licence sales only 8am to 9.30pm



Waste Law (2021)
Ban on single-use plastics





Check out Clean Wave Foundation (& their documentary)

Voluntary agreement with Cruise Lines & Shipping Agents (2022-2026)

- Limit of 3 cruise ships a day
- Only 1 of 3 can be a mega (>5000) cruise ship
- Up to 59,500 passengers a week
- Staggered arrival of ships to avoid 'sense of saturation'



Cannot be legally enforced

#### Forum of Civil Society in Mallorca

- Rethink Mallorca's model of tourism
- 'Quality, not Quantity' versus 'Degrowth'



#### Government of the Balearics Pact for Sustainability

- Working Groups to report Spring 2025
- 'Limit Tourist Arrivals' versus 'Degrowth'



# Policy Tensions

Jaume Garau (Palma XXI)

"The public sector & business sector are simply talking about limiting tourist arrivals, but that would not be sustainable because it is no longer sustainable. There is only one option – degrowth"
