# Living Museum:

Maker's Residence and Exhibition Space

Year 1 Architecture at Queen's University of Belfast, 2024

### **About the Project**

This book showcases an architectural project by Year 1 architecture students at Queen's University Belfast (QUB). Their challenge? To design a residence and exhibition space for a maker at one of two hypothetical sites within the Ulster Folk Museum.

We are extremely grateful to National Museums NI for making this project possible. Inspired by the Reawakening project, students were tasked with exploring sustainable practices through traditional skills and construction, as seen on-site. Each student designed a space for a specific maker, emphasising sustainable living, spatial interactions (public and private), exhibition design, materiality, crafts, and heritage conservation, while also responding to the museum's rural landscapes.

## Design Brief: Residence & Exhibition Space for a Maker


In semester two, year 1 BSc Architecture students at Queen's University of Belfast continue to develop core skills in design and communication, learning CAD alongside developing their model making, hand drawing and digital drawing techniques, such as collage and sectional perspectives.

The primary project required students to Design a Residence for a Maker, with exhibition space, in a unique setting: the Ulster Folk Museum, a living museum. The project consisted of four parts: site analysis, design story (research), detailed observation, and the individual final design. Students collaborated on site surveys and analysis. Simultaneously, they researched design stories in pairs, exploring themes such as exhibition design, traditional craft and sustainable construction.


Students conducted a detailed observation of a threshold or aperture, of their choice, from the museum. This exercise combined hybrid drawing techniques (one by hand and one using CAD) and precise scaling, with a focus on the spatial overlaps of thresholds, which often function as transitional social spaces that mediate environmental, acoustic, and visual boundaries. The drawings captured experimental qualities such as material texture, light, atmosphere and inhabitation.

For the final design, each student imagined a maker's residence for a specific maker, such as a blacksmith, weaver, thatcher, rope maker, and incorporated an exhibition area. Students were encouraged to use research and consider the maker's craft process, environmental context, accessibility, circulation, materiality, and sustainable construction to inform their design.















Elevation 110 AutoCod and Photoshep





















2. Building Types

1. Sectional Perspective




2. Exhibition Detail Model







