HSN7020 Complexity in Pregnancy: Midwifery Care for Women and Families – this module should only be taken by students with extensive experience in maternity care

HSN7077 Perinatal Mental Health – this module should be taken by students (midwives, health visitors, mental health nurses or family nurse practitioners) with either current or past experience of caring for women during pregnancy, birth and up to one year post-birth.

MID7016 Principles of Critical Care in Midwifery – this module can only be taken by students who are registered midwives, or eligible for registration as a midwife with the NMC and currently working in a health care setting in NI

MID7078 Implementing Continuity of Midwifery Carer for all Women – this module can only be taken by students who are registered midwives, or eligible for registration as a midwife with the NMC currently working in a midwifery clinical setting in a health care setting in NI

NMP7002 Health Assessment – this module should be taken by registered health care professionals

SPR7078 Leading for Health and Social Care Professionals – this module has replaced SPR7041 Leading and Facilitating and should not be taken again

SPR7085 Acute Cardiac Nursing – students should have experience of working in an acute setting

HSN7120 Advancing the Speciality of Orthopaedic and Fracture Trauma Nursing – students must be working in a relevant clinical setting (ie Orthopaedics/ED) ** please note: this module is distance learning and therefore should not be taken by students undertaking the MSc on a study visa**

Students should not repeat modules at Masters level that they have undertaken previously at Degree level.
