## Sample interview station 2 transcript: A very high scoring answer

I think this is important because you shouldn't make any assumptions in a situation like this such as assume that they just can't be bothered. There might be a reason why they aren't really contributing. Maybe they could be down about something or maybe they are just overwhelmed and can't concentrate on the project. If that is the case, then maybe talking to someone might help. I would also offer to talk through what their contribution to the project is if that is what they are struggling with. Also, I'd like to add that after I have spoken to the group member who isn't contributing, then I would speak to the other group members to try and understand how they feel. Hopefully by responding to the problem and involving everyone in a discussion, will help to improve relationships within the group and then get the project moving again.'
