## **How to Apply**

Interested applicants must complete the online Expression of Interest (EOI) Form on or **before 21**st **November 2022**. The Faculty of AHSS will carry out an internal selection stage to identify the candidates that will be supported to submission. Applicants will be informed of the outcome of the selection process in <u>December 2022</u>, ahead of the scheme closing date of 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2023.

A written statement of support from the appropriate Head of School is a required part of the Expression of Interest (EOI) submission, we strongly advise potential candidates to make contact with the relevant Head of School as soon as possible:

## **Eligibility**

Candidates should consult the guidance on the Leverhulme Trust's website prior to submitting an Expression of Interest (<a href="https://www.leverhulme.ac.uk/early-career-fellowships">https://www.leverhulme.ac.uk/early-career-fellowships</a>). In particular, they should note that applicants:

- Must hold a doctoral degree or equivalent research experience by the time they take up the Fellowship. If currently registered for a doctorate, they must have submitted their thesis by 4pm on 23 February 2023;
- Must have **not** yet have held a permanent academic appointment whose duties include research;
- Must **not** have existing funding in place for a duration equivalent to or greater than the duration of the Early Career Fellowship;
- Must be within four years of the award of their doctorate. Those who submitted their thesis for viva voce
  examination before 23 February 2019 are not eligible unless they have since had a career break. However, due
  to the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Trust will accept applications from candidates who
  submitted their doctoral thesis for examination between 23 February 2018 and 23 February 2019 if they can
  make a case for their work having been impacted by the pandemic;
- Must **either** hold a degree from a UK higher education institution (any degree) at the time of taking up the Fellowship **or** at the time of the application deadline hold a non-permanent academic position in the UK (e.g. fixed-term lectureship, fellowship) which commenced no less than 4 months prior to 24<sup>th</sup> February 2022.

Successful candidates will be supported by the Faculty and Queen's dedicated Research Development Team in the development of full applications, <u>due 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2023</u>.
